<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup>The 2019-20 season was cut short by the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic which led to a complete shutdown of Broadway in March 2020. The season tallies for the 2019-20 season reflect performances through the week ending March 8, 2020, the last full week of performances of that season. The 2021-22 season marked the return of Broadway. However, the start of the season was delayed by 10 weeks; re-openings were staggered; and there were numerous COVID-related cancellations of performances, including during the December/New Year's holidays. The 2022-23 season was the first full season since Broadway came back.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup>The 2018-19 season was the highest grossing and best attended season in recorded history.

## PLEASE ALSO NOTE:

- While the season tallies reflect all performances that took place during that season, a production is only included in the count of new productions in the season in which it officially opened. Accordingly, Grey House and Once Upon a One More Time are included in the count of new productions for the 2023-24 season, though both began previews at the end of the 2022-23 season. Home, which began previews at the end of the 2023-24 season but officially opens in the 2024-25 season is not included in the 2023-24 count of new productions.
- For the breakdown of new productions, a production is considered "original" if the show had not previously appeared on Broadway. Accordingly, *Appropriate* is reflected in the 2023-24 breakdown of new productions as an original play, and *Gutenberg!* The Musical! is reflected as an original musical. For the 2024 Tony Awards, however, these productions were deemed eligible in the respective "revival" categories.
- The 2022-23 season marked the first time that the play *Ohio State Murders* appeared on Broadway; for the 2023 Tony Awards, however, the production was deemed eligible in the "revival" category.
- Due to the March 2020 Broadway shutdown, the following productions began previews in the 2019-20 season but did not officially open until the 2021-22 season: *Company; Diana, The Musical; Hangmen; Mrs. Doubtfire; Six; The Lehman Trilogy; and The Minutes*. Accordingly, they are included in the 2021-22 count of new productions.
- While *Girl From The North Country* officially opened in the 2019-20 season, it was deemed eligible for the 2022 Tony Awards since the opening occurred too close to the March 2020 shutdown for Tony nominators to see it.
- Due to the ongoing impact of COVID-19, both *Girl From The North Country* and *Mrs. Doubtfire* played two separate engagements during the 2021-22 season. Each show was included only once in the count of new productions, however, in the season in which the production originally opened (2019-20 and 2021-22, respectively).
- The 2021-22 season marked the first time that the plays *Lackawanna Blues* and *How I Learned to Drive* appeared on Broadway; for the 2022 Tony Awards, however, both productions were deemed eligible in the "revival" category.
- A revival of Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf? began previews just prior to the shutdown in March 2020 but never opened. It is
  included in the grosses, attendance, and playing weeks of the season tallies for 2019-20 but not in the count of new productions.
- The 2018-19 season marked the first time that the play *The Waverly Gallery* appeared on Broadway; for the 2019 Tony Awards, however, the production was deemed eligible in the "revival" category.
- While *Frankie and Johnny in the Clair de Lune* began previews during the 2018-19 season, it officially opened and is reflected in the count of new productions for the 2019-20 season.
- While *The Boys in the Band* began previews during the 2017-18 season, it officially opened and is reflected in the count of new productions for the 2018-19 season.

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
